2021-THE YEAR OF HOPE

Love liberates!

"God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent the Son into the world, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." John 3:16-17

John 3:16 is genuinely one of our favourite verses in the bible. Why? Each one of us will have our own reason. It seems to me that part of its appeal is that it speaks about the real conundrums of life. Life is hard. Condemnation is real. Bondage is its consequence. However, Love liberates. That is true in families, in communities and our churches.

Our Old Testament reading highlights the Israelite's similar life experiences from bondage in Egypt to the Promised Land. Although the story itself is puzzling because it contains aspects of ancient rites and God's action against his people, the story is about people struggling, complaining and speaking against God in their time of trials. Yet despite their rebellion and lack of trust, God, once again, provides healing and relief for their troubles.

Both stories, from different times and contexts, are being brought together this week by Jesus' declaration that "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life." (Jn 3:14) As the serpent is the symbol of life for the Israelite, Jesus being lifted up on to the cross is God's gift of healing and new life.


Condemnation is a specialty of human beings. We are trying most times to apportion blame on others or shift blame entirely to those around us. Condemnation is not God's thing. The Good News of Jesus Christ is about healing and rescue. Jesus did not come to add a greater burden of condemnation to our already heavy load. Instead, when he is lifted up on the cross, we are assured of his forgiveness and restoration.

Jesus action on the cross lies at the heart of love that John 3:16 speaks about. God's unconditional love for us all is assured no matter what others thought of us or what we thought of ourselves.

What God does for us, we are also to do for one another. We are to love others sufficiently to forgive, not condemn, to uplift, heal and restore. We are called to be the mediators - the church has the ministry of making reconciliation, forgiveness, restoration real to ourselves and others. What an awesome responsibility. Let us allow love to liberate us as we seek to live out this good news amongst our family, friends and the community.

This year's Lenten Study will be held at 5 pm on Sunday afternoons in the Church hall, in safely distanced seating, on the four Sundays Feb 28, March 7, March 14 and March 21. The study book is Rowan Williams' Being Christian and it is about strengthening the practices that underlie our lives as Christians. They are on Baptism, Bible, Eucharist (communion), and Prayer.
